K-2: We have been working on fitness and how it affects our body. We have also learned a bout a few different body parts and how they can assist our fitness. Additionally, we are working on the 'overhand throw.' The focus is stepping, twisting, and turning!

3-5: Fitness has been a big focus over the last few weeks. Talking about fitness builds an understanding of its importance. We have practiced many different exercises through activities that encourage fitness challenges. The goal was to understand the many different varieties we have when engaging in exercise. Most recently, we have begun a jump rope unit - We are learning very quickly how physically demanding jump rope is. At the same time, we have discovered many activities within jump rope that we really like and can even do using partners.

MS: These boys and girls have worked really hard over the last few weeks completing their fitness testing. Amongst the tests, we focus on muscular strength, muscular endurance, cardiovascular strength and endurance, as well as flexibility. The tests we use to measure the fitness components are the push-up test, pull-up test, curl-up test, flexed-arm hang, pacer test, mile run, and sit & reach test. I am super proud of this group and the effort they put into their individual performances and now have goals set for testing again in the spring!

Athletics: Boys soccer went undefeated this year, a perfect 9-0 mark. Girls volleyball vastly improved throughout the season and went out with a BANG, beating STAB at home in three sets. XC highlighted their season by hosting our first ever home meet, the CCS Invitational, where the girls placed first and the boys second! Boys and Girls basketball is wrapping up tryouts and practices begin next Monday, Nov. 1st.

Personal note: Friday Nov. 5th will be my last day until 1/3/2022. My daughter will be born very soon and we are very excited! We feel blessed to have time away and adjust to life as parents. (Wonderful, original works) and learning how to reflect, accept and offer feedback and write Artist Statements. In small groups, older students have been rising to the occasion and participating in age appropriate critiques with kindness and sincerity -- as well as a discerning eye.

As I continue to transition the Art Room into a space that facilitates more choice based learning, I find myself delighting in some of the comments I hear as I move about the room providing individual instruction. 





