### **Social Studies**

This week we talked about Election Day and held our own classroom elections! Mrs. Milnor's class elected Mrs. Milnor for President! We also learned about Veterans Day and completed a whole grade level poster that will be displayed at our Veterans Day prayer service on Monday.

### Math

This week we finished our unit on addition and took our assessment. The students are not expected to master all addition strategies but rather be exposed to all so that they can choose which one works best for them in certain situations. We then started our unit on subtraction. Next week we will continue learning about subtraction.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

#### Reading

Through our main story of the week, *Maddi's Fridge*, as well as supplemental readings, we made valuable connections (text to text and text to world) and explored ideas of friendship and charity. We also examined how to read a website while discussing internet safety. Next week we will use the short week to complete any unfinished work we may have, review past skills, and listen to books about being thankful.

#### **Grammar**

This week's focus was on common nouns vs. proper nouns. We addressed the need for proper nouns (specific names of people, places, and brands) to be capitalized and compared nouns like school and Charlottesville Catholic School.

#### **Writing**

This week we included proper nouns into our writing as we wrote about friendship and ways to help one another. We also wrote within Daily 5 activity rotations and in other content areas.

## Theology

This week, we celebrated National Vocations Week by learning about the different ways God calls us to serve. Then, we made cards for a Seminarian to encourage him in his vocation. Finally, students learned about the November virtue of the month, Advocate, and how Servant of God Thea Bowman was an example of advocacy for African Americans both within and outside of the church. Next week, we will begin learning about the liturgical seasons of our faith.
