In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We are going to be learning about the first English colonies in North America. Students will be tested on sections of the United States. Students need to identify each state and write the correct name and its capital. To make this more manageable, students will only be learning one section at a time. The **SW Region test** will be on Tuesday, November 12th. **November 19th & 20th** will be the test dates for **all 50 states and capitals**. Students need to identify the correct state by shape/location and be able to write the state and capital name (spelling and capital letters count).

Math

We have started to review long division using the mnemonic "Does McDonalds sell cheese burgers?" Knowing your multiplication facts is a must for success. Please continue to practice multiplication facts at home. We will have a test on long division 11/13.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy

(<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their

planner. The 2nd qtr. requirements are to complete *Get ready for multiplication and division with whole numbers and decimals* (unit 4) and *Get ready for powers of 10* (unit 6). Students will work on Khan Academy as part of their extended math time.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we continued discussing and analyzing *Wonder*, and students turned in the banner project connected to the novel. We also had a quiz on nouns (common/proper and singular/plural), and students received a new list of spelling words (High Frequency Words, List #1). We also began studying possessive nouns.

Next week, in the short week, we will focus heavily on *Wonder* and will finish that late next week or early the following week. Students will have a test on the novel the week before Thanksgiving break. We will also work with the new spelling words and continue to study possessive nouns and have a quiz on possessive nouns on Thursday.

Theology

We had a quiz this week on the vocabulary words associated with the liturgical calendar, and we did several activities for Vocation Awareness Week.

Next week, we will focus on the liturgical calendar itself and will begin an in-class project on the calendar. That project will involve creating a liturgical calendar for 2024-2025 for each classroom in the school.
