Please know that we will be going outside even in the very cold winter months. Our girls can wear navy tights or capris to keep them warm outside. Of course, pants and polos are also a good option. Bare skin on frigid days is a concern. Please help us by helping your child on days they wear a jumper. Thank you!

Even though the weather is turning colder, we will continue to get the students outside for recess as often as possible. Please make sure your child has the outerwear needed so that they can participate in recess. Below are the guidelines we follow:

- \circ $\;$ Students should stay inside if the wind-chill factor is below 25°F.
- If the wind-chill is in the 30s, students should have a coat (not a sweatshirt) and it should be encouraged that their heads are covered (hat or cinched coat/sweatshirt hood).
- If the wind-chill is in the 40s, students should at least have a sweatshirt on.
- Students who do not have the proper outerwear will sit in the front office for recess.

Social Studies

This week we started traveling around the world to see how other countries celebrate the winter holidays. We started this week by visiting the USA and talking about how many traditions in the USA are influenced by other countries. We then completed a flip book which will be kept in our suitcase. We will also be visiting Mexico, Sweden, and Italy.

Math

This week we continued our unit on subtraction. We learned how to draw a model to help us solve subtraction number sentences. We also talked about how we should keep our models organized so that we can ensure we get the right answer. We also learned how to use a number line to count back. We talked about how we can use addition to check our subtraction problems. Next week we will continue learning about subtraction within 20.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read *Oskar and the Eight Blessings* by Richard Simon and Tanya Simon. We talked about how good readers make mental images or visualize while reading a book or text. Creating these mental images helps students dive deeper into the text and targets their long term memory.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we talked about plural nouns. We learned when to add an s and when to add an es to make a noun plural.

<u>Writing</u>

This week we learned in our anchor text that Oskar celebrated Hanukkah. We read a nonfiction reader to help us gain some background knowledge and then wrote about different traditions.

Theology

In Theology, we learned about why we celebrate the feast of Christ the King by comparing Him to earthly kings and talking about what makes Him different - His sacrificial love! We, also, prepared for the season of Advent by making salt dough advent wreaths. We will keep these wreaths at school until the last week before break and will add a candle to our wreaths each week as we await the coming of Christ at Christmas.

Science

We focused on social studies this week.

Colder Weather is here!

Please make sure that your child brings something warm and long sleeve to school each day (e.g., jacket, sweatshirt, sweater). We will continue to go outside, weather permitting, for recess, lunch, and snack as much as we can.
