- Even though the weather is turning colder, we will continue to get the students outside for recess as often as possible. Please make sure your child has the outerwear needed so that they can participate in recess. Below are the guidelines we follow:
 - Students should stay inside if the wind-chill factor is below 25°F.
 - If the wind-chill is in the 30s, students should have a coat (not a sweatshirt) and it should be encouraged that their heads are covered (hat or cinched coat/sweatshirt hood).
 - If the wind-chill is in the 40s, students should at least have a sweatshirt on.
 - Students who do not have the proper outerwear will sit in the front office for recess.

Social Studies

Students say prayers and the Pledge of Allegiance each day. Students learned about maps, the city CCS is in, the state they live in, the country they live in, the continent they live on and what planet they live on. Math

Students are continuing to recognize numbers 0-20. We also have been reviewing subtraction, addition as well as comparing groups. The students have also been enjoying centers which include work with a teacher, math binders and math games. The students are doing so well in math! Students did Thanksgiving number activities too.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The focus this week was on short i word families. Students are learning to blend sounds to read consonant-vowel-consonant words. We worked on these sight words: do,did,so,get and what.Please continue to practice sight words at home. Next week's sight words are: like, this, will, yes and went. Students are working on pencil grip and writing on the lines. Students are learning the structure of Daily Five. As we send books home, please have your child point to each word and read the book three or more times. We are working hard to help students build independence by approaching tasks with the following guidelines: get started right away, work the whole time, stay in one spot, work quietly, build your stamina.

Theology

We continued to learn about God's ten commandments and that they are made to keep us safe just like the rules at school. Also, we started to talk about advent and how it is a time of preparation and waiting for baby Jesus to arrive.

Science

This week in the science lab we focused on social studies by learning about our city, state, country, continent and planet.
