2nd-5th grade: The theme of these weeks has been "Celebrations around the world." The students are learning how there are other celebrations in winter time, for example: kwanzaa, hanukkah, diwali, among others. They are also learning new vocabulary related to these topics. It is celebrated in other cultures according to their countries and background. They also had fun dancing and learning the choreography of the song "Feliz Navidad." Every day the students review vocabulary related to numbers, calendar, weather and the alphabet. They also do activities and games to reinforce what they have learned in class.



7th and 6th grade:

The seventh grade students learned how to tell the time in Spanish. They learned how to tell time on the hour, quarter, and half hour, how to tell time on the hour and after the hour (:00 through :30) and finally before the hour "5 minutes to 1". "Es la una menos cinco"

Topic ¿Qué te gusta hacer? What do you like to do? They are learning new vocabulary related to activities they like or don't like to do. They are also learning the topic of indefinite verbs.



The sixth graders students learned about Spanish Subject Pronouns (Yo=I Tú=you él/ell/usted=he/she/you (formal) Nosotros/Nosotras=we vosotros/vosotras=you "people" ellos/ellas= they/they). When they are singular and plural+male and female form. They learned that they are words that replace the subject, name or noun of the sentence and are used to replace people, animals or things, without having to name them. They also learned to distinguish that the plural pronoun vosotros and vosotras is used only in Spain.

- Which pronoun to use, for example "you" when speaking to your sister: Tú.
- When to write the correct pronoun for each subject
- Recognize and write when the pronoun is used in plural
- Write sentences using the appropriate pronoun. Example: "Maria is my friend" = Ella es mi amiga.

Adjectives. Its definition, function and general grammatical rules when using them in spoken and written language.

For example: Adjectives that end in **o** drop the final **o** and add **a** after a feminine noun.

Example: el niño mexicano la niña mexicana

In Spanish, most adjectives come after the noun.

Examples: el gato negro = the black cat

la vaca gigante = the giant cow
