Math

The Praying Puppies and the Holly Jollies have nearly completed the unit on Subtraction (with and without regrouping). As a reminder, strong automaticity with math facts positively impacts this unit, so please continue to practice addition and subtraction facts often. Flash cards, timed worksheets, and calling out problems while driving around town are all great ways to fit in some extra practice. We will be strengthening these skills at school through

games, timed worksheets, flash cards, and more!

Next week, we will review all of the essential skills in this unit in preparation for the Unit 4 test on Wednesday. On Thursday and Friday, we will festively incorporate the holiday season into our math lessons!

Literacy (Reading / Writing / Spelling)

The Holly Jollies and Praying Puppies continue to work on both nonfiction and fiction in small groups. This week, they have had the opportunity to read all about the Lakota tribe of the Plains, while comparing and contrasting the Lakota tribe with the Powhatan tribe of the Eastern Woodlands.

Spelling instruction is underway! Please refer to the <u>Spelling Homework Choice Board</u> for weekly spelling homework choices. Word lists will be introduced weekly, with tests occurring on Fridays. Please check Friday Folders for graded tests. Due to the short week and impending break, students will study and work with holiday words next week and will not be tested on these words.

Science / Social Studies

Throughout the month of December, we will be studying Native Americans. As the Holly Jollies and Praying Puppies examine these civilizations, they will learn how the natural environments/landscapes of each tribe influenced the type of homes built, the sourcing of food, the type of transportation, and the delegation of necessary jobs. North American geography will also be highlighted this month as the kiddos identify major rivers and mountain ranges in each of the three regions..

This week, our super second graders focused on the Lakota Tribe of the Plains. The kiddos loved designing tipis (while utilizing a Lakota picture dictionary) and creating an interactive village that shows their knowledge of all things Lakota.

Religion

This week, students had a special opportunity to spend time in Adoration with Jesus in the Chapel. The children really opened their hearts and minds to this one-on-one time with Our Lord. We also reflected on the season of Advent and the children made goals of what they can do each day to prepare their hearts for Christmas.
