School Announcements:

Social Studies

This week we continued learning about different winter holidays around the world. We visited Israel for Hanukkah, Africa for Kwanzaa and India for Diwali. Next week we will learn about Christmas in the USA and the Lunar New Year.

Math

This week we continued learning about subtraction. We learned about how to subtract the same number and zero. We also learned about how to solve word problems within 20 using the CUBES strategy. Next week we will finish up our unit on subtraction.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

<u>Reading</u>

This week we analyzed and compared nonfiction and narrative nonfiction texts. We discussed the "story-like" elements that exist within a narrative and the difference between showing versus explaining. We also discussed how both text and illustrations can convey information to the reader. With a focus on hibernation, the book *Over and Under the Snow* as well as other nonfiction readers were used to practice reading and reviewing relevant nonfiction text and graphic features on this subject matter. Next week we will read *The Animals Santa* and will practice analyzing illustrations to discover important details from the story.

Writing/ Grammar

This week we highlighted the pronouns I, me, and my and practiced using these words in our writing. We also wrote about animals from our nonfiction texts, describing their unique characteristics. Additionally, after analyzing various pictures and illustrations, we wrote about what we thought the images were trying to convey. Next week will continue with these writing skills as well as verb tenses.

Theology

This week, we continued decorating our Jesse Tree as we read the stories of Moses, Samuel, Jesse, David, and Solomon. We "lit" the second candle on our advent wreaths and talked about the theme of peace during this second week. Finally, we learned about our December virtue of the month, accepting, and how St. Martin de Porres exemplifies this virtue by treating every person he came into contact with as a child of God, worthy of respect and kindness.

Science

We focused on Social Studies this week.
