Curriculum

Math

This week we reviewed 2 Dimensional shapes such as a, square, triangle, rectangle, trapezoid, rhombus, hexagon, pentagon, and octagon and practiced with 3 Dimensional shapes such as a cube, cone, cylinder, rectangular prism, pyramid, and sphere. We looked at their attributes (i.e., faces, edges, and vertices) and completed several activities to reinforce and distinguish these shapes. After the break we will introduce fractions.

Reading and Language Arts

Reading

This week we read the book *The Polar Express* and used it to discuss and review several skills. We analyzed the story and identified key details found in the beginning, middle, and ending sections. Specifically, we determined a sequence of events and considered cause and effect as it related to the story as well as established a purpose for reading. We further stressed good reading strategies/habits such as reading a text more than once and analyzing pictures as well.

Grammar

This week we reviewed Verb Tense (Past: -ed, Present: -s, -es, and Future: will + verb), Parts of Speech, and Punctuation. We will continue to look at these skills as well as review and practice additional spelling patterns and writing rules moving forward.

Word Study/Spelling

We practiced sorting our words, identified closed syllables (a short vowel followed by consonants) and open syllables (a syllable that ends in a vowel with a long sound), identified phonemes (individual sounds) and focused on the voiceless /f/ sound. We also looked at the spelling rules/generalizations for how to spell the /f/ sound (fan, phone, laugh, off. And continued reviewing previously taught spelling patterns and skills. Next week students will receive a new word sort (spelling list).

Writing

This week we continued to develop our writing by incorporating previously taught skills (i.e., verb tense, punctuation, and descriptive adjectives). We also completed writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing and dictation of sentences.

Religion

This week we continued to talk about Advent. We learned that Advent is a season of waiting and that we are preparing to accept Jesus into our hearts. We also continued working on our Jesse Trees that will tell the story of Christmas and discussed the season of Christmas.

Science/Social Studies

This week we discussed Christmas, holiday customs, and traditions, as well as completed various themed activities.
