Math

Congratulations to the Holly Jollies and the Praying Puppies for completing Unit 4 with a flourish! Hooray for our super subtractors!

Following the Winter Break, we will begin a unit on telling time. Students will be able to discern the difference between A.M. and P.M. and will learn to tell time to the hour, half hour, quarter hour, and in five minute intervals.

While we will be taking a brief break from computation, please continue to support your child's automaticity with math facts by practicing daily at home.

Literacy (Reading / Writing / Spelling)

Upon our return in January, the Holly Jollies and the Praying Puppies will begin new novels in reading groups, study verbs in grammar, pen a host of fabulous writing pieces related to winter and our units of study, attack new lists of spelling words, and hone their handwriting skills.

Science / Social Studies

In our final week studying American Indians, our spectacular second graders focused on the Pueblo Tribe of the Southwest. The kiddos loved building a pueblo village, highlighting the tools, homes, transportation, food, and jobs of this amazing tribe in their construction. While studying tribes living in three distinct regions of the United States, the Praying Puppies and Holly Jollies took the opportunity to explore U.S. geography in context, including land and water features such as the James, Mississippi, and Rio Grande Rivers; the Rocky and Appalachian Mountains; and the Great Lakes.

We'll kick off the new year by studying the contributions of famous people, exploring inventions and innovations throughout U.S. history, and experimenting with magnetism!

Religion

This week, students practiced praying Visio Divina (Divine Seeing) as we reflected on the stories of the Annunciation and the Nativity. The children did a great job creating "shrines" of the Annunciation to help remember Mary's humble and profound "yes" to God!

Finally, we had the opportunity to celebrate the Mass in person once again. Great job to all of our ministers!

When we return from break, students will discuss what prayer is, learn different types of prayer, and why it is important to pray.
