

### Week in Review

### Religion

We read a Bible story each day, prayed, and learned about animals in the Bible. We read Luke chapter 2. Each day, students added an ornament to their Jesse tree. It has been an exciting week as we celebrated the third week of advent. Students "lit" the third candle on their advent wreaths and added several ornaments to their Jesse Trees. Your child may continue these activities at home.

Science and Social Studies

We learned about Christmas traditions from around the world and made a corresponding craft: Germany: Christmas trees, Brazil: birds, Philippines: star, and Italy: nativity We also made gingerbread houses in the science lab.

Students made several ornaments to hang on their trees: popsicle stick and clothespin nativity, fingerprint battery tea light snowman, popsicle stick Rudolph, and popsicle stick snowman.

Mrs. Dudley made each student a candy cane reindeer.

#### Math

We explored subtraction and played Christmas themed math games. Subtraction tends to be a harder concept to grasp than addition. Please use teachable moments to practice subtraction. (There were 5 Christmas cookies on the plate and three of them were taken. How many are left?)

Language Arts


The sight words were a review: there, out, be, have, am. Please continue to practice these at home.
