Math

The Cheetahs and Sloths used their skip counting prowess to help them begin a new unit on telling time! Upon completion of this two week unit, students will be able to explain the difference between an analog and digital clock, locate the minute and hour hands on an analog clock, read, write/draw times on both analog and digital clocks to 5-minute intervals, solve story problems with elapsed time, determine whether an event occurs during A.M. or P.M hours, and match the number of minutes found in key vocabulary (quarter hour = 15 minutes, half hour = 30 minutes, one hour = 60 minutes. Additional key vocabulary includes: quarter til/to/of, quarter past, half past, and o'clock, The unit test will occur on Friday, December 9.

Thank you for helping your child practice addition and subtraction facts. Fact practice is paying off! Keep up the good work!

Literacy

The Cheetahs and Sloths are crazy for reading groups! Our beautiful bookworms love acting out passages to "become" the characters in the book, practicing intonation and expression with partner reading, and creating their own discussion questions to develop deeper understanding of the character, setting, and plot! It's a total joy to watch our radiant readers taking the reins of the reading groups!

In addition to reading in context, the Sloths and Cheetahs are practicing sight words and decoding both real and nonsense words. Each and every child is, or is beginning to, recognize him/herself as a READER!

Happy handwriting! Our students are eagerly learning how to print each letter of the alphabet, as well as numbers by practicing individual letter formation, as well as forming learned letters within words and sentences. We anticipate completing our print unit in January and beginning a unit on cursive shortly thereafter.

Sensational spellers! Check your child's folder for graded spelling tests today and congratulate him/her on a job well done!

Religion

This week in Religion, students explored the Sacrament of Reconciliation as some of our Cheetahs and Sloths prepare to receive it for the first time this weekend! We reviewed the order and effects of the Sacrament, watched a video from Fr. Walter at St. Thomas Aquinas explaining the Sacrament and exploring the Confessional, discussed important vocabulary, examined our consciences, and watched an episode of Brother Francis. While we started our Jesse Tree this week, we will be taking a deep dive into the season of Advent! We will also begin to start planning and preparing for our upcoming Mass on December 15th. If your child has a reading for the Mass, they will bring it home to practice next week.

Science/Social Studies

Originally, the Cheetahs and Sloths were set to learn all about magnets this week! However, we've decided to postpone this unit until March in order to collaborate with Mr. Bruscia's middle school crew!

Instead, our super scientists began a two-week unit on invention and innovation. While identifying and describing how science and technology have impacted/influenced community, lifestyles, environment, and geography, the Sloths and Cheetahs quickly learned the many ways that technology has enhanced our lives, and that it can come in many forms (not all of which are battery powered or electric!). Our sweet second graders got a real kick out of learning/seeing what certain items were like (and if they even existed!) when their parents, grandparents, and great grandparents were young, such as television, airplanes, computers, phones, cars etc.
