## Social Studies

This week in Social Studies, students began chapter 3 which focuses on Jamestown. Students also learned about interesting topics such as Roanoke Island and historical figures such as John Smith, Powhatan, and Pocahontas.

The test over chapter 3 will take place on Thursday, December 8.

## Math

This week in Math we have taken great strides with Multiplication. We are reinforcing fact fluency with Multiplication tables 1-12 and dove into 2-digit by 2-digit multiplication. We are demonstrating flexibility with strategies like partial products, standard algorithms, the distributive property and utilizing area models. We have also been practicing our problem solving methods as we're tackling multi-step word problems with various operations. <u>Our Ch. 5 Math test is scheduled for Tuesday, December 6th.</u>

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in Language Arts, students launched into our new unit that consists of a research project regarding natural disasters! This is a great unit in which nonfiction texts will be used. Students will also learn about different types of nonfiction text structures and how to take effective notes.

# Religion

This week in Religion, we did our annual Virtus lesson on Boundaries and had the opportunity to problem solve through tough scenarios together as a class. I hope the kids feel more comfortable employing some strategies and navigating their own comfort levels and boundaries in their day-to-day lives. We have been focused on Advent and enjoyed learning about the meaning of this liturgical season. We had the opportunity to begin our Advent ABC's- a daily reflection compilation, and 4A did a wonderful job planning for Mass. We began Unit 2 Lesson 8. This Unit 2 Lesson 8 Quiz is scheduled for Friday, 12/9.

## Science

This week in Science we began Ch. 5. We are studying characteristics of an ecosystem (individuals, populations and communities), and the various factors of influence on an ecosystem. The Chapter 5 Test is scheduled for Thursday, 12/8.

\*Ecosystem projects are due Monday, 12/12. This is primarily an at home project. Students will have one class period on 12/9 to work on it. Project instructions were handed out today (12/2) in class.
