12/8 (Thursday) is 5th grade's shopping day

The Charlottesville Catholic School St. Nick's shop is a chance for students in JK-5th grade to shop for some small holiday gifts for family members. The shop will offer items ranging from \$2-\$15 that students can choose to purchase for family members (sibling gifts are available in the lower dollar range and some of the parent gifts are in the upper range). A form has been sent home for parents to complete listing the names of each gift

recipient and dollar amount range that each student can spend per person on the list. Participation is optional. Parents can elect to donate any unspent funds to the school, or to request change.

Each class will have a designated shopping day/time. A few students at a time will go in to shop (the rest of the class will watch a Christmas movie while waiting). Once inside, each shopper will walk around with a volunteer parent shopper to help them choose gifts within their shopping budget. Gifts will be wrapped by a separate set of parents. Volunteers are needed to help with shopping and check-out/wrapping.

Math

*We will be working on mastering our multiplication table 0-12 and doubles by the end of the 2nd quarter (this is an extension). Please practice the basic multiplication facts at home or in the car coming to and from school. Knowing your multiplication facts is a vital skill that students will be needing for success in math in school and in daily life.

*Students will need to complete (mastery level) Khan Academy *Add Decimals and Subtract Decimals* by the end of the 2nd quarter.

This week we continued to work on long division and problem solving involving division. We will be working with multiplication and division using decimals. Look for your child to be using the words "over, over, up" when dividing with decimals.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we finished reading and annotating *Wonder*. We also took a quiz on collective nouns, and received a new set of spelling/vocabulary words (Homophones, List #2). The test for those will be next Thursday.

Next week, students will also take a test on Wonder (on Wednesday), and will begin a four-paragraph essay based on the book. They will be taking this assignment through the writing process, so they will be hand-writing the rough draft, revised draft, and final draft of the essay, turning them all in for a grade. We will also work on how to correct sentence fragments and run-on sentences, and students will have a quiz on that material early the following week.

Religion

This week students took a quiz on the liturgical calendar and did the first of two lessons on Protecting God's Children. We will do a brief unit on Advent and Christmas next week and the following week.

Science

This week we focused on specific elements of the periodic table. We will be learning about the physical and chemical changes. Students will be participating in several matter labs this week.
