Math 6 (Garland): This past week, we commenced with putting the finishing touches on the unit entitled "Rational Numbers". We will review this coming week and test on Thursday, December 8th on Fraction and Decimal Operations. After this, we will focus on reviewing for the Midterm Exam.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): This past week, we got into using Algebra Equations to solve word problems. This coming week, we will further this skill by solving word problems that have 2 Let statements in them. (a precursor to multi-variable Algebraic Equations) We will quiz this coming Friday on these skills. After this, we will focus on reviewing for the Midterm Exam.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we started a new unit, entitled "Right Triangles". This coming week, the students will investigate and learn to solve Special Right Triangles. Towards week end, we will focus on reviewing for the Midterm Exam.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we finished our operational work with decimals and are headed towards our 2nd test of the quarter on Tuesday or Wednesday December 6th or 7th. The kids have also been working on the Exam Review Packet. It has been online for several weeks, and every kid was given a hard copy in class on Thursday. This assignment will be turned in on Friday, December 9th.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we have focused on graphing lines from slope-intercept form and standard form. We will be having our 2nd test of the quarter on Tuesday, December 6th on Slope & Graphing Lines. The kids have also been working on the Exam Review Packet. It has been online for several weeks, and every kid was given a hard copy in class on Thursday. This assignment will be turned in on Friday, December 9th.

6th Grade Composition (Kerrigan): Next week, students will have a test on *Vocabulary Power Plus* Lessons 7-9 on Wednesday. For the midterm exam, students have received a study guide to complete, and a suggested timeline for breaking their studying into daily chunks. 6th Grade Literature (Kerrigan): We are reading *A Long Walk to Water* in class. This novel is the stories of two children during the Second Sudanese Civil War. Alongside it, we have been exploring Sudanese culture and their water crisis. We will continue reading it next week.

7th Language Arts (Lowdon): We began using our Wordly Wise books for vocabulary instruction this week. The test on Lesson 1 will be on block day next week. We spent the week reading and discussing Chapter One, *The Pearl;* they are to read Chapter Two by Monday. On Friday, students took the first grammar quiz on parts of speech and diagramming. The second IRA is due on Monday, Jan. 9.

8th Language Arts (Lowdon): On Friday, students took a test on Wordly Wise Lesson One. We are reading and discussing *Lord of the Flies* in class; homework is to read Chapters 3 and 4 over the weekend. The second IRA is due on Monday, Jan. 9. The Memoir Project is due on December 12; directions for this fabulous keepsake are in Google classroom.

6th: This week we isolated DNA from wheat germ using detergent and rubbing alcohol. We discussed mutations and how some are selected for success and lead to changes in traits, while some are not. We also learned about viruses. Next week we will continue to learn about Viruses and compare them to bacteria and protists.

7th: This week we continued to learn about compounds and how to name them using the periodic table. We experimented with compounds to determine solubility and conductivity in relation to the elements found in each compound. We even practiced modeling compounds to help visualize how many atoms are found in each compound. Next week we will continue with covalent bonded compounds.

8th: This week we discussed and modeled landforms with our homemade playdough. We discussed the three types of volcanoes and their characteristics. We also learned about the various types of lava associated with each type of volcano. We also learned about Earthquakes and how to plot the epicenter based on the speed of the waves traveling. Next week we will continue with Earthquakes and start mapping.
