### **Important School Announcements**

 There are 2 separate Christmas concerts for students this year. The 3rd-5th Grade concert is on Wednesday, December 18, and the JK-2nd Grade concert is on Thursday, December 19. Both concerts start at 6:15PM.

Important concert night information:

 Students should arrive at their classrooms between 5:40 PM and 5:55 PM. When they arrive, they are to go directly to their classrooms. Parents should go directly to the gym upon arrival.

- At the end of both concerts, K-5 students will return to their homerooms. Parents must sign their children out with their teachers.

### Math

We began our unit on strategies to subtract fluently. This week we focused on using the number line to count on and count back. We also took some time to review previously learned concepts involving addition strategies such as making friendly numbers, using the number line and decomposing addends.

In Mrs. Bryan's class we are finishing up our strategies for adding and regrouping to 20 using a number line in various ways as well as adjusting.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we listened to some of our favorite holiday books such as <u>The Wish Tree</u> by Kyo Maclear, <u>How to Catch Santa</u> by Jean Reagan and <u>Little Red Sleigh</u> by Erin Guendelsberger. We focused on retelling by summarizing, author's purpose and the theme of a story. We also started reading our whole class read aloud called <u>The Family Under the Bridge</u> by Natalie Savage Carlson. The story is about finding family in the unlikeliest of places during the holiday season.

In writing, students have been working on writing using complete sentences. We have been focusing on the writing process by prewriting, writing drafts, editing and revising and writing final drafts. We also learned how to write a friendly letter, which we will continue next week.

In grammar, we focused on types of sentences and matched our sentences to the correct punctuation.

Mrs. Bryan's class has been reading through <u>The Family Under the Bridge</u> as our class read aloud. We also have been reading Christmas picture books working on our KWL charts for <u>How Santa Got His Job</u>.

In writing we have been working on writing a diary as an elf, so we have several daily entries for these. We have also started working on an informative writing booklet for Selling a Home at the North Pole.

## Theology

This week we set up our Jesse Tree, where we will discuss each ornament that represents the stories from the bible that lead up to Jesus' birth. The students started making their own paper version. We discussed the importance of the advent wreath and what it represents. We will light a candle each week during morning prayer. We also learned about morality and the ten commandments, which we will continue next week.

Friday, we will discuss St. Nicholas and listen to a Christmas book read aloud by the Charlottesville Student Council Officers.

### **Social Studies**

This week we continued to learn about Native Americans: The Lakota, Pueblo and Powhatan. We also discussed holidays and traditions, which we will continue next week. We are also starting our holiday economics unit. We have explored wants and needs, producers and consumers, goods and services and more! Next week we will work on setting up a holiday shop using goods and services in the classroom!

### Science

This week, we focused on social studies.
