## **Important School Announcements**

\*\*\*Please review the **winter dress code** and make sure that your child is bundled up for winter with coats, hats, gloves, etc! Only blue socks are to be worn with the winter uniform. Also, please remember that leggings should not be worn for Spirit Days (unless they are under a jumper).

We will have mass on Monday, December 9, to celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

Assessments for incoming Kindergarten students for the 2025-2026 school year will take place on Friday, January 10. Current Kindergarten students will NOT have school that day.

- There are 2 separate Christmas concerts for students this year. The 3rd-5th Grade concert is on Wednesday, December 18, and the JK-2nd Grade concert is on Thursday, December 19. Both concerts start at 6:15PM. Important concert night information:
  - Students should arrive at their classrooms between 5:40PM and
     5:55PM. When they arrive, they are to go directly to their classrooms.
     Parents should go directly to the gym upon arrival.
  - At the end of both concerts, K-5 students will return to their homerooms. Parents must sign their children out with their teachers.
    - JK students will be dismissed after they sing.
  - Students should wear their "Christmas best."

- We will have Mass on Monday, December 9 for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. There is no Mass on Tuesday, December 10–students do not need to be in formal dress uniforms that day. We will have a prayer service for the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on Thursday, December 12 at 8:15AM.
- Every Advent and Lent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered for CCS students, as well as Adoration, which is a special quiet time of reflection spent in front of the Blessed Sacrament. On Tuesday, December 10, we're in need of some parent support to usher students from the confessionals (library/conference room) to the chapel. ### **Social Studies**

We learned that Christmas trees and Christmas markets are world-famous in Germany, about the Brandenburg Gate, famous landmarks like the Eiffel Tower, and that children in France get every Wednesday off of school! We also started our Jesse Tree projects, learned a few phrases in German and French, how to dance the Chicken dance, and we sang a song about France!

### Math

We finished Unit 7, which includes understanding subtraction. We discussed word problems and the strategies that we used to determine whether we need to add or subtract. We also continued to practice counting to 100! Some of them already know how to count to 100. At this time, the students are now expected to count to fifty. The students have also been counting to 100 by 2s, 5s and 10s. We have calendar time during math every day. The students continue to learn our days of the week song, months of the year song and seasons every day.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The students are continuing to practice reading to self and work on writing. Please have your child read the books we send home every Friday to you three times to practice sight words and fluency. Our sight words this week were: like, this, will, yes, went. Our sight words next week will be: came, now, no, are, ride.

## Theology

We learned about Advent, discussed Christ's birth, and we continue to light our Advent candle daily as we prepare our hearts for celebrating Christ's birth.
