#### Announcements

- Even though the weather is turning colder, we will continue to get the students outside for recess as often as possible. Please make sure your child has the outerwear needed so that they can participate in recess. Below are the guidelines we follow:
  - Students should stay inside if the wind-chill factor is below 25°F.
  - If the wind-chill is in the 30s, students should have a coat (not a sweatshirt) and it should be encouraged that their heads are covered (hat or cinched coat/sweatshirt hood).
  - If the wind-chill is in the 40s, students should at least have a sweatshirt on.

- Students who do not have the proper outerwear will sit in the front office for recess.
- Friday, December 15 is our Tacky Christmas Sweater Day at CCS! Students will be allowed to wear appropriate tacky Christmas sweaters to school that day.
  - Students in K-5 may wear either their school uniform jumpers or pants, or CCS sweatpants.
  - Middle School students may wear school uniform skirts or pants, blue jeans, or CCS sweatpants.
  - All students must wear their uniform shoes.
  - Any students not participating must wear their normal uniform.

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### Social Studies

This week in SS, students finished their chapter on Jamestown. Students are learning about the trials and tribulations early settlers went through. We also learned about the House of Burgesses and other important pieces of early American history.

## Science

### Math

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

# Theology

In Theology this week 4th grade practiced planning for Mass on Tuesday December 12th, and we had the opportunity to attend Reconciliation and Adoration here at school. We began our Advent Calendar and stories of the Jesse Tree this week, and began Unit 2 Lesson 9 in our Theology textbook- "How do we celebrate God's forgiveness and healing?" We had a lesson on our December VIrtue of the month and completed activities like the Tau cross and Nativity scene pertaining to St. Francis of Assisi -our exemplary role model in living out this tenet. There will be a Unit 2 Lesson 9 Quiz at the end of next week.
