Religion

On Wednesday, we learned about different Advent symbols and their meanings including candles, the Advent wreath, and evergreen branches while recording the information and creating a beautiful flipbook! Conception as a school community on Thursday, Friday we dove deeper into the story of the Annunciation, where Gabriel appeared to Mary to tell her that she would be the Mother of our Lord! To remember Mary's courageous "yes," students created beautiful stained glass windows of the scene.

Student volunteers were distributed any necessary readings this week to practice at home and we will be practicing as a grade in the chapel this Tuesday and Wednesday. Science/Social Studies

On Friday, December 9, the Cheetahs and Sloths were treated to an in-school field trip! The Jamestown Settlement and American Revolution Museum at Yorktown joined our curious cuties to extend the learning about Native Americans we began in October. Over the course of our hour-long event, the Sloths and Cheetahs investigated the lives and society of the Powhatan Indians. How fancy that they also had the chance to use inquiry methods and handle reproduction artifacts! Our social scientists also explored the Powhatan Indian culture, including the roles of different members of its society, government structures, and how the Powhatan Indians used natural resources to produce tools, clothing, houses and food. What a perfect prequel to our upcoming study of Economics in February!

Innovate and invent! This week, the Sloths and Cheetahs learned how to become a great inventor. After learning about cool new materials like underground magnets and glass that can be switched from opaque to transparent, our imaginative inventors had the opportunity to brainstorm and advertise inventions themselves. The only catch? Their invention had to somehow incorporate stretchy, bouncy glass! Check out their amazing ideas on the walls of CCS!

Part of being a great inventor is being willing to fail! In our second lesson, the Cheetahs and Sloths worked in teams to save "Bobby" (aka a bobby pin!) from a crash landing by inventing a paper device to slow the fall. They worked like inventors, learning from their failures!

Rainy days call for imagination! The Cheetahs and Sloths "took" a boat trip that resulted in being stranded on a deserted island! Eek! Realizing the tropical sun would take a toll on their sweet skin, our impressive innovators took matters into their own hands by designing and building a hat that offered sun protection, taking into account the different properties of materials used for clothing, such as texture, flexibility, and absorbency.

Our final activity in this unit was the Elf Drop! After decorating a hard boiled egg to look like a mischievous elf (it's amazing how much more invested the kiddos are when the egg is personable!), the Sloths and Cheetahs teamed up in the STEM Lab to design a contraption to protect their elf from potential Christmas mishaps. This festive and fun STEM challenge was a hit! Thank you to the Sloth and Cheetah families for so generously donating materials and time to our classrooms!

This unit has brought out the best in our stellar scientists, who have been busy hypothesizing, problem solving, questioning, designing (and re-designing!), testing (and re-testing!), and building a growth mindset. One of our favorite quotes is from Thomas Edison. When asked by a reporter how it felt to fail so many times, Edison answered, "I have not failed. I've just found 10,000 ways that won't work." So true!
