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Winter Dress/Outerwear

Social Studies

Students say prayers and the Pledge of Allegiance each day. Students are learning about Christmas traditions in other countries. Mr. Korinek spoke to students about Christmas traditions in Austria.

We will have a Gingerbread party on Thursday, December 15th from 1:30-3:00.

Math

We continued our Math Journals this week. Each day we graph the weather for the day, add a number to our calendar, draw a circle in our 180 day ten frame chart, and color in a number in our 100s chart. We composed and decomposed numbers up to 10. We will begin our unit on addition after Christmas.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The focus this week was on short o word families. Students are learning to blend sounds to read consonant-vowel-consonant words. Please continue to practice sight words at home. Students are working on pencil grip and writing on the lines. Students are learning the structure of Daily Five. As we send books home, please have your child point to each word and read the book three or more times. We are working hard to help students build independence by approaching tasks with the following guidelines: get started right away, work the whole time, stay in one spot, work quietly, build your stamina. Students have been highlighting sight words and reading Luke Chapter 2.

Religion

We read a Bible story each day, prayed and talked about how God led the Israelites to the promised land. We also have a science related devotion each day and we are learning a lot about God's amazing world. Each day, students listen to a Bible story, color an ornament that represents the story, and hang it on their Jesse trees. We are also reading Luke chapter 2 each day. On Tuesday, students left paper shoes out in the hallway for Saint Nick to fill while middle schoolers read stories to classes.

Science

We are making lots of crafts related to our Christmas Around the World unit. This week we made several ornaments: Nativity, reindeer, and candy cane.
