Science

This week students will learn the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates and what they need from their ecosystems to survive.

Next week students will have their unit test on plants. They will be introduced to the five classes of vertebrates and their traits. We will begin working on our vocabulary foldable study guide on vertebrates.

Social Studies

This week students will learn terms to know; ancient, architecture, and inventions along with Egyptian hieroglyphics.

Next week students will learn how ancient Egypt has changed in modern times and the contributions we use today.

Math

This week students are learning about how to tell time using the words, quarter till, quarter after, and half past. They will be introduced to elapsed time through word problems.
