Junior Kindergarten

<u>Math</u>

Ms. Wawner's class wrapped up their unit on positional words by playing the game, "Where's the Mustache?" The group started learning about ordinal numbers this week and will continue practicing them next week, while also reviewing concepts we have learned this year. Ms. Shank's class continues our unit on positional words. We are also working on increasing our number sense. The students have been "subitizing" or quickly reading a set of objects and telling the number. We have used ten frames and ingroups with objects in random order They are learning to "count on" and other activities to increase their number sense.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class had great fun learning about syllables this week. We practiced finding the number of syllables in words using 5 different methods: jaw drop, robot speak, clapping, humming, and jumping. We learned about the letter H this week and read many books on hibernation, a concept we are studying during our Animals in Winter unit in Science. We will spend next week reviewing the letters and sounds we have learned thus far, as well as vowels, syllables, and our sight words. Ms. Shank's class worked on the letter "F". We read some nonfiction and fiction books about the rainforest. We read a book by the Author Jan Brett called "The Umbrella". We did an author study of her earlier in the year with other books she has written such as "The Mitten" and the "Hat". We compared "The Umbrella" to "The Mitten" and talked about some things that were similar and different such as her plot and illustration style. Next week we are going to read a story called "The Great Kapok Tree" and talk about ecology.

Religious Education

Ms. Wawner's class is learning about Saint Valentine as a background to Valentine's Day next week. We will begin learning about the season of Lent. Ms. Shank's class started our

unit on Moses by reading about how Moses was saved by the Pharoah's Princess. We also read about the burning bush and how if we listen we can hear God talk to us. The students completed a craft of the burning bush. Next week we'll be learning about the Exodus from Egypt and the parting of the red sea. We also compared Moses to our other heroes from the Bible we have studied, (David, Noah, Daniel, and Joseph) and talked about how they all had in common the fact that they trusted in God no matter what. Then on to a unit on Lent.

Science/Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class started an "Animals in Winter" unit this week. Knowing that animals need food, water, air, and shelter to survive, we learned how animals behave during winter when food can be scarce and it's cold. We focused on hibernation this week and will learn about migration and adaptation in the coming week.

Ms. Shank's class began our month-long unit about the rainforest. The students entered the classroom with a canopy of leaves in the doorway on Monday and the sounds of a rainforest. Courtesy of Mr. Bruscia, our middle school science teacher, the students were able to look at some snake skins and investigate his collection of insects. We learned about the blue morpho butterfly and made our own. We are still doing some experiments on matter. Ask your student how we got raisins to dance. Next week we'll be learning about ecology. The students will create a human food chain/web on the blacktop. We are excited to have the 6th graders come to our class on Thursday to help us with our research reports on animals. Each student will be given an animal to research and then make a craft of their animal. Our faith buddies will be helping us with our crafts. We will also be building the layers of the rainforest in our classroom and placing our animal crafts in the correct level of the forest.
