Kindergarten

Kindergarten had an exciting week! Second grade shared some awesome magic tricks with magnets. Kindergarteners explored magnets in the STEM lab on Thursday.

Social Studies

Students say prayers and the Pledge of Allegiance each day. We are learning about famous black Americans.

Math

We continued our Math Journals this week. Each day we graph the weather for the day, add

a number to our calendar, draw a circle in our 180 day ten frame chart, and color in a number in our 100s chart. We composed and decomposed numbers up to 10. We finished subtraction. Please have your child practice counting by ones, fives, and tens to 100. Next week, we will begin our unit on time, practice time to the hour with clocks, read The Very Grouchy Ladybug, make a ladybug out of an egg carton and play February themed math games.

We are into our unit on Time (first) and Money (second). Please use everyday teachable moments to help reinforce these skills.

Math Practice at Home

Tell the time on a clock in your house to the hour or half hour. Identify coins and count change.

Add or subtract items in your house or while shopping at the store.

Group and count objects in your house.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

We continued fluency passages. Each passage focuses on a particular word family, consonant blend, or digraph. Please have your child read these passages to you at home. Students are learning to blend sounds to read consonant-vowel-consonant words. Please continue to practice sight words at home. Students are working on pencil grip and writing on the lines. Students are learning the structure of Daily Five. As we send books home, please have your child point to each word and read the book three or more times. We are working hard to help students build independence by approaching tasks with the following guidelines: get started right away, work the whole time, stay in one spot, work quietly, build your stamina.

Reading Practice at Home

Please let your child read a decodable reader (word family focused), or leveled reader book to you each night. We'd also encourage you to read to your child each night as well. The effect size for both is great.

Listen to a story.

Read at least one story or fluency passage to an adult each night.

Practice reading nonsense words or other cvc words.

Practice sight words.

Religion

We read a Bible story each day, prayed and talked about how God led the Israelites to the promised land. We also have a science related devotion each day and we are learning a lot about God's amazing world. Kindergarten had a religion trivia contest and did very well.

Science
