English Language Arts

This week in grammar we studied for and tested on pronouns. For reading we worked on our final whole class novel study, <u>Charlotte's Web.</u> We focused on comprehension through our novel study packet and played a game to work on context clues. We are really trying to work on applying our vocabulary. We continued on with our cursive. For writing we started really focusing on poetry.

Next week will be a lot of the same as we continue working through <u>Charlotte's Web</u>, poetry, and cursive. With the Spelling Bee next week, Valentine's Day, and no school on Friday we will not be having spelling next week.

Religion

This week we started our next unit in Religion - How do we live what we believe? We took all the knowledge we have learned, and saw how to apply it to how we live every day. We looked at prayer this week with a focus on praying the Psalms.

Next week, we will be continuing on this unit, focusing on why we pray.

Math

We are doing great with our multiplication facts! This week we had our 5-8 multiplication facts quiz and next Wednesday will be our 9-12 multiplication facts quiz. We continue to explore real world problems and word problems involving multiplication. This week we added tree diagrams and combination graphs to our set of multiplication skills.

Next week we will begin exploring the skills needed for division. This will be a new skill for which we will go over many methods just like multiplication. It may take a few days for the ideas to come together so if your student seems a little confused at first be sure to keep their confidence high and remind them how well they have done with multiplication. I will work on making division as fun as possible and maybe even bring in my banjo to sing a divide by 2 song.
