Week in Review

Religion

Science and Social Studies

Students learned about the life cycle of a ladybug.

We watched a Mystery Science segment on the heart and tried to determine our pulse rate by placing our fingers on our wrist. We also used a pulse oximeter to measure our pulse rate.

Math

We began our unit on time, practiced time to the hour and half hour with clocks, listened to The Very Grouchy Ladybug, made a ladybug clock and played February themed math games.

Language Arts

The sight words were: brown, four, ran, saw, well. Please continue to practice these at home.

We are practicing short vowel word families. Please have your child read the fluency passages to you five or more times to build reading fluency.
