Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We will be learning how the US Constitution was created and the compromises that were made.

Math

Students will be learning to divide fractions and simplify (reduce) their answers. The key words are "keep, change, flip".

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 3rd quarter requirements are to complete Math: 5th grade for Coordinate Planes (unit 12), Line Plots (unit 15) and Multiplying Decimals (unit 8).

**All students need to be checked off for their multiplication facts 0-12 and xx by the end of 3rd quarter.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week students had the end-of-novel test on *Love That Dog.* We also continued our unit on prepositions, and our unit on Greek and Latin affixes. They also completed the Poetry Packet. The due date for the Poetry Packet, however, has been extended to Tuesday because of the snow days. This week, we also began a short unit on the Civil Rights Movement, in which students will read several articles on the topic and identify the main idea and supporting details for each. Students also participated in a Valentine's Escape Room, focusing on poetry and figurative language.

Next week, students will have the quiz on prepositions and will continue the study of Greek and Latin affixes. In the short week, we will also start reading one or two short stories focusing on conclusions and generalizations (similar to making inferences). We will also continue our unit on affixes, and the test on those will be early the following week.

Theology

This week, students began a unit about the sacraments and participated in a webquest on the topic. They will have a test on the sacraments next week.

Next week, students will also begin memorizing the Nicene Creed. This is longer and more complicated than the Apostles' Creed, so we will be dividing it into three parts. Students will quizzes on the first two parts and then recite the entire prayer for a test grade in a few weeks.

Science

We have begun our unit on rocks and minerals. We have some great labs coming up!
