Math 6 (Garland): I really appreciate the student's patience with my time away from school due to the flu. We used this past week to allow students to catch their breath and process material that was assigned to them in my absence. This coming week, students will begin the process of translating and evaluating algebraic expressions.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): I really appreciate the student's patience with my time away from school due to the flu. This coming week, we will explore the concept of 180 degrees in a triangle and start working with the Pythagorean Theorem.

This coming week, we will put the finishing touches on our Quadrilateral Unit, by examining midsegments of trapezoids(and relate this concept back to triangles). Math 7 (Reid): This past week the kids continued to work with solving 2 step equations. Next week, we will continue to solve equations now using the distributive property and combining like terms.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we finished up our unit on solving systems of equations, inequalities and word problems. The kids will have their 2nd test of the quarter on Wednesday, February 19th or Thursday, February 20th whoever is your child's block day for math. The test will be on solving systems of equations & inequalities and word problems.

6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): Next week we will begin our study of verbs.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): This week we took the first *Maniac Magee* vocabulary quiz and discussed character development in our novel. Students should be caught up through Ch. 39 by Tuesday. Next week, a project related to our book will be introduced.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, students submitted their fifth IRA of the year. We finished up Orwell and *Animal Farm* and began our next unit on the stories and poems of the great 19th-century American classic, Edgar Allan Poe, with a creative writing assignment. Next week, we learn about Poe's life and delve into "The Cask of Amontillado."

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, students submitted their fifth IRA of the year. We continued with our analysis of Hillenbrand's essay, "A Sudden Illness." Next week, we continue with part three of *Unbroken*. We have a major writing project coming up for this unit. This is a third person nonfiction narrative based on an interview with a friend or family member. This project will constitute a significant part of the Literature grade for this quarter.
