### Math

Marvelous with Money! The Sloths and Cheetahs observed each coin (penny, nickel, dime, and quarter), as they practiced locating identifying features. They also compared and contrasted the size, color, and value of each coin. Check between those couch cushions and under your car seat for long lost change! Your Sloth or Cheetah will benefit from having extra practice with real money!

Pool noodles! SplashLearn.com is a marvelous math resource for home use! Your child may access the site for free to complete work that we assign, including new assignments all about money!

Fluency fireworks!! Keep those math fact skills sharp! After our unit on money, the Sloths and Cheetahs will return to computation with a unit focused on three-digit subtraction.

## Literacy

Pronoun Party! The Sloths and Cheetahs tried their hand at possessive, indefinite, and reflexive pronouns this week. After a brief review on Monday, they'll flex their grammar muscles on a pronoun quiz!

Spelling is back in full swing! Due to the four-day schedule both this week and next, the Sloths and Cheetahs will work with the current word list again next week. Please complete at least two homework activities each week from the <a href="https://example.com/homework/menu">homework menu</a>. The test for these words will occur next Friday, February 24.

And the crowd goes wild! Our captive audience of Junior Kindergarteners adored the puppet shows! This multidisciplinary project involved reading, writing, speaking/performing, creating (props, puppets, scenery), and collaborating. We couldn't be more proud of the Cheetahs and Sloths!

# Religion

What a wonderful job 2nd grade did leading Mass for CCS this week! We are so proud of them all. Later during the week, we finished our unit on the Trinity with a rousing review game of Stinky Feet (ask your Cheetah or Sloth about all the fun!) followed by a culminating quiz. It's so impressive that theologians this young can get a strong grasp on such a big mystery!

Next week, as a community, we will be celebrating the beginning of the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Then, we will be learning about the beautiful season of Lent as we listen to / watch Brother Francis and begin praying our weekly Stations of the Cross.

## Science/Social Studies

After exploring and experimenting with magnets, the Sloths and Cheetahs learned all about gravity and friction, testing out each with lots of fun experiments this week! Ask your child about the ball races, gravity cup challenge, and designing their own super fast slides! Next week, in the hopes of teasing out a snow day or two, the Sloths and Cheetahs will investigate weather!
