## Social Studies

This week we continued to learn about maps. Mrs. Mauney's class made our own bedroom map and made up our own color code. Mrs. Milnor's class had snow days during our social studies day. We will continue with maps next week.

### Math

This week we began our 5th unit of the year - geometry! We identified, described, and constructed 2D shapes based on given attributes. Next week we will continue our study of shapes.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

#### <u>Reading</u>

This week we listened to the book "The Big Bed" by Bunmi Laditan and talked about point of view. Because of the short week we did not test on the book or the skill. Next week we will be reading the biography, "The Radiant Child," about the life of the artist, Jean Michel Basquiat. We will be learning about Biographies as well as practicing with Main Idea and Supporting Details within nonfiction texts.

#### <u>Grammar</u>

Next week we will focus on writing dates with correct capitals and commas.

#### <u>Writing</u>

This week we wrote about point of view, focused on using the appropriate article when constructing sentences, and responded to various writing prompts. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well.

## Theology

This week we read from the book of Matthew how Jesus tells His people about the greatest commandment; to love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. In chapel this month we have been learning about Saints of color in observance of Black History Month. This week, we learned about the life of St. Josephine Bakhita! Next week, we will begin preparing for the season of Lent.

### Science

We focused on Social Studies this week.
