Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We have been learning about how the US Constitution was created and the compromises that were made. Students will be making a Bill of Rights poster (see p 354) to go along with our study of these important additions to our constitution.

Math

Students will be learning to divide fractions and simplify (reduce) their answers. The key words are "keep, change, flip".

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To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (khanacademy.org). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 3rd quarter requirements are to complete Math: 5th grade for Coordinate Planes (unit 12), Line Plots (unit 15) and Multiplying Decimals (unit 8).

**All students need to be checked off for their multiplication facts 0-12 and xx by the end of 3rd quarter.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week students turned in the Poetry Packet, and we continued our short unit on the Civil Rights Movement in which students read several articles on the topic and identified the main idea and supporting details for each. Students also reviewed prepositions and had a quiz on that material on Friday.

Next week, students will have a test on the content of the Civil Rights Movement packets and will resume the study of Greek and Latin affixes. They will have a quiz on the affixes early the following week. We will also read a few short stories from the *Journeys* anthology next week.

Theology

This week, students continued the unit on the sacraments and reviewed the webquest on the topic. They will have a test on the sacraments next week (rescheduled from this week), and the webquest page (returned to students in class) will be the best study guide for the material. Students also began memorizing the Nicene Creed, and they will have a recitation quiz on the first third of the prayer next week.

Next week, students will also begin a unit on the structure of the Bible and how to cite and find passages in both the Old and New Testaments.

Science

We have begun our unit on rocks and minerals. We have some great labs coming up and a guest speaker.
