6th Grade US History: This week the 6th graders learned about the Harlem Renaissance and the Great Migration. Next week they will explore the causes of the Great Depression.

7th Grade US History: This week the 7th graders learned about the Cuban Missile Crisis. Next week they will begin exploring the Apollo 11 mission to the Moon.

8th Grade World History: This week the 8th graders learned about Sub Saharan African civilizations. Next week they will begin looking at the Italian Renaissance. As part of their Renaissance Unit they will be working on a Renaissance Project, more information will be sent home next week.

Math 6 (Garland): We finished this last week talking about translating expressions. This week, we will use this skill to take evaluating expressions to the next level. Students will have a quiz, this Tuesday, that involves translating and evaluating algebraic expressions. This coming week, we will explore combining like terms and the distributive property as a means to simplify algebraic expressions.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): We finished last week by exploring the Pythagorean Theorem. An in class project will be assigned this coming week and will be due on Friday, February 28th. The goal is to have students create Pythagorean Theorem word problems and solutions (with digital diagrams). Equation editing software will be modeled in class to add a more mathematically polished presentation.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we finished our Quadrilateral unit and will have a take-home assessment assigned this coming Monday (due Tuesday). This coming week, students will work with ratios and proportions to help solve for missing pieces of similar figures. We will then move into proving triangles similar and looking at specific proportions in similar triangles (angle bisector and side splitter) and how it relates to proportions of parallel lines. We will conclude this week by investigating ratios associated with areas and perimeters of similar figures.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we continued our work with solving 2 step equations. A lot of time was spent helping the kids understand that they needed to move numbers away from the variable by adding/subtracting first and then multiplying/dividing to isolate the variable. We also placed a lot of emphasis on how we show multiplying on both sides (using parentheses) and dividing both sides (using a fraction bar) by a number. Next week, we will add on the extra layer of simplifying before we solve an equation. We will use the skills we already have of distributing and combining like terms.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we completed our unit on systems of equations & inequalities. Our next unit will deal with the rules of exponents. We will call them "Power Rules". The kids will be learning six rules in a call and response form, much like military

cadences. Once they are started, I will list them in the newsletter so that you can help your child practice them. This is one of the most fun units to teach!

6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): This week, we finished a lesson in *Vocabulary Power Plus*. Next week, we will continue learning new vocabulary and will study verbs.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): This week, students worked on their *Maniac Magee* scrapbook project, which is due this upcoming Tuesday. The *Maniac Magee* test will be on Wednesday during Lit block.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we began our Poe unit with the classic gothic tale, "The Cask of Amontillado." Students also learned more about Poe's life. We will have a short quiz on Poe's life on Tuesday of next week. We will also delve into analysis of "Amontillado" and begin a comparison between "Amontillado" and another Poe classic, "The Tell-Tale Heart."

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we finished up our analysis of "A Sudden Illness" and made progress on part three of *Unbroken*. Students conducted interviews as the first stage in our major writing project for this quarter, a third-person nonfiction narrative inspired by Hillenbrand's *Unbroken*. Thank you for your support with this project. The rough draft is due **Friday, March 7th** and I will be working with students in class to help craft their narratives.
