Please know that we will be going outside even in the very cold winter months. Our girls can wear navy tights or capris to keep them warm outside. Of course, pants and polos are also a good option. Bare skin on frigid days is a concern. Please help us by helping your child on days they wear a jumper. Thank you!

Even though the weather is colder, we will continue to get the students outside for recess as often as possible. Please make sure your child has the outerwear needed so that they can participate in recess. Below are the guidelines we follow:

- Students should stay inside if the wind-chill factor is below 25°F.
- If the wind-chill is in the 30s, students should have a coat (not a sweatshirt) and it should be encouraged that their heads are covered (hat or cinched coat/sweatshirt hood).
- If the wind-chill is in the 40s, students should at least have a sweatshirt on.
- Students who do not have the proper outerwear will sit in the front office for recess.

Social Studies

This week we continued our study of Black History Month. We will learn about some famous African Americans in history and at the end will conduct a research project on one.

Math

This week we continued our unit on geometry and fractions. We constructed 3D shapes, classified and sorted 3D shapes, and described 3D shapes based on given attributes. Next week, move into learning about fractions as we examine equal and unequal shares and partition shapes into halves, fourths and quarters.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read the biography, "The Radiant Child," about the life of the artist, Jean Michel Basquiat. We learned about biographies and practiced identifying the Main Idea and Supporting Details within nonfiction texts. Next week, we will read "Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion" and will learn the elements of a folktale and how to compare and contrast.

Grammar

We focused on writing dates with correct capitals and commas. Next week, we will study adverbs of time and how they answer the question: when?

Writing

This week we wrote about key details from the life of Jean Michel Basquiat. There were also several writing opportunities across content areas including sentence dictation, spelling, and written responses in science and math. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well.

Theology

In Theology, we began a unit on prayer by determining the what, when, how, and who we might pray for using the 5-finger prayer method. Next, we learned the Stations of the Cross prayer and walked it in our classroom using Stations posters and booklets the students colored. Next week, we will talk about the Our Father, including the meaning of words within the prayer and why it is called "The Lord's Prayer". We will, also, examine the Hail Mary prayer and Glory Be prayers.

Science

This week we focused on social studies.

Colder Weather is here!

Please make sure that your child brings something warm and long sleeve to school each day (e.g., jacket, sweatshirt, sweater). We will continue to go outside, weather permitting, for recess, lunch, and snack as much as we can.
