Social Studies

Students say prayers and the Pledge of Allegiance each day. We continued to learn about famous black Americans and will continue to do that during this Black History Month. We also watched videos and took quizzes on famous black Americans.

Math

Students are adding numbers 10-15 this week. The students have also been enjoying centers which include work with a teacher, math binders and math games. The students are enjoying and practicing a lot of skills during math. We are also having the students recognize coins.

Please use everyday teachable moments to help reinforce these skills:

Math Practice at Home Identify coins and count change.
Add or subtract items in your house or while shopping at the store. Group and count objects in your house.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

We continued fluency passages. Each passage focuses on a particular word family, consonant blend, or digraph. Please have your child read these passages to you at home. Students are learning to blend sounds to read consonant-vowel-consonant words. Please continue to practice sight words at home.

Theology

During Theology this week, we watched some short video clips about Lent and the ways adults practice giving alms, fasting and repenting. We will also be practicing looking and participating in the stations of the cross in chapel or outside at the top of the hill.

Science

This week in science we watched a video on different types of items then and what they look like now. We also had the students complete a then and now booklet.
