Next week, we will make Stations of the Cross to hang in our classrooms and start our next unit as we learn about how we praise and thank God through Mass, devotions, and more!

## Science/Social Studies



Ask your child to explain why the sand at Pfeiffer Beach in Australia is purple! We'll be busy experimenting with the world around us to build deep understanding!


