#### Math

We have begun "Mad Minute" math as a way of strengthening our math skills. Students complete 15 problems in the span of one minute and advance to the next level after they demonstrate mastery. Once children pass a level, they earn a congratulatory certificate that will be sent home in their Red Friday Folders. Thank you for your continued support with this very important work!

A huge benefit of extra math fact practice is that it gives the Praying Puppies and Holly Jollies an extra boost with their computation work. We've explored three strategies for three-digit computation and are putting your cuties to work as problem solvers!

#### Literacy (Reading / Writing / Spelling)

Using our Biography Project, TWOsday, and Science Day as inspiration, the Holly Jollies and Praying Puppies completed a ton of themed activities this week, including identifying homophones, authoring writing pieces titled "When I'm 22," reading nonfiction pieces about pairs, finalizing research, and beginning the big work of applying their knowledge.

#### Science / Social Studies

The Biography Projects are already fabulous! It's wonderful to watch our sweet students identify and capitalize on their strengths. Who could forget our adorable actors who have been busily memorizing their self-written scripts and running their lines with peers.

After greeting each other like mad scientists, we started the day collaboratively constructing the tallest marble runs we could build, and then learned about how toys are invented. Then, the Holly Jollies and the Praying Puppies were treated to hover disk rides and a science read aloud.
