Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation.We will be looking at the growing pains of the new nation.

Math

Students will be learning to divide fractions and simplify (reduce) their answers. The key words are "keep, change, flip". The Ch. 11 test on dividing fractions is on March 4th. Our next unit is measurement and data.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 3rd quarter requirements are to complete Math: 5th grade for *Coordinate Planes* (unit 12), *Line Plots* (unit 15) and *Multiplying Decimals* (unit 8). The 4th quarter requirements to complete for Math: 5th grade are *Multiplying Fractions* (unit 6), *Algebraic Thinking* (unit 13), and *Dividing Decimals* (unit 9)

**All students need to be checked off for their multiplication facts 0-12 and xx by the end of 3rd quarter.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week students finished our short unit on the Civil Rights Movement and had a test on the articles. We also worked on Greek and Latin affixes and had some more practice with editing sentences.

Next week, students will have a quiz on Greek and Latin affixes and will also read a few short stories from the *Journeys* anthology. We will also begin a research project that will be a joint language arts/social studies assignment. Students will be researching and writing a paper about a topic related to the Civil War, which they will study in social studies in the fourth quarter. We will assign topics next week and begin the research.

Theology

This week, students took a test on the sacraments and recited the first third of the Nicene Creed for a quiz grade. We also began a unit on the structure of the Bible and how to cite and find passages in both the Old and New Testaments. There will be a quiz on the first two sections of the Nicene Creed, and a test on the structure of the Bible next week. There is a Slide Presentation on Google Classroom, containing the information students will need to know for the quiz on the Bible.

Science

We are going to start our unit on fossils. We will be making plaster molds of "fossils".
