6th Grade US History: This week the 6th graders learned about the Great Depression and its impact on the American people. Next week they will learn about the New Deal and the rise of dictators in Europe.

7th Grade US History: This week the 7th graders learned about the 1960s culture and the Civil Rights Movement. Next week they will finish their 60s unit and take their test on Friday.

8th Grade World History: This week the 8th graders learned about the Late Middle ages and were introduced to the Italian Renaissance. They also began working on their Renaissance Research Project. It is a major assignment that will use every skill they have learned in history this year. Math 6 (Garland): Students worked really hard on Simplifying Algebraic Expressions this past week. This coming week, we will look at the Distributive Property as a step in simplification. We will then work with the reverse process of the Distributive Property, factoring out a GCF.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): We finished working with the Pythagorean Theorem this past week. On Monday, students will receive a take-home assessment on the Pythagorean Theorem which will be due Tuesday. For the remainder of the week, we will get into Geometric Transformations, first looking at Reflections and Translations.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we investigated ratios associated with Perimeter and Area of Similar figures. This coming week, we will look at the Geometric Mean of a figure and learn how to calculate it. Towards the end of the week, we will quiz on our Similarity Unit and start reviewing for a test on the Unit.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we continued to solve equations as well as solve word problems with a specific structure to them. We are preparing for next week's Test on Solving Equations & Word Problems. The kids will get their test review on MOnday of next week. Their test will be on either Wednesday (03.05) or Thursday (03.06) whichever is their block day. The kids also found out that their **3rd quarter Binder Check will be on** 

**Tuesday, March 11th**. This will be a 20 point quiz grade weighted twice in the gradebook. It will not be accepted late.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we continued working with our "Power Rules". Please say the following phrases to them and see if they respond. "Like Bases...." and "Power of a Power...." and "Break 'em down into factors...." and finally "Divide...." Hopefully they will answer all 4 of those phrases with a response  $\bigcirc$  The kids also took their Test on Systems & Word Problems. We will finish up our unit on Power Rules and Test at the very beginning of 4th quarter. The kids also found out that their **3rd quarter Binder Check will be on Tuesday, March 11th**. # Composition, Literature, and Language Arts -

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6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): This week, we studied verb forms, verb phrases and participles. Next week, we will continue with verb tenses.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): This week, we wrapped up our studies of *Maniac Magee.* Next week, a poetry recitation project will be introduced. Our next class novel is *Abel's Island*.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, students took a short quiz on Poe's life and works. We engaged in an analysis of two classic Poe stories, "The Cask of Amontillado" and "The Tell-Tale Heart." Next week, we delve into Poe's love poetry with "Annabel Lee" and "Eleonora."

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, students got started writing their third person narrative project. The rough draft of this project is due Friday, March 7th and will count as a project grade. We also continued with Part 4 of *Unbroken*. We will do an analysis quiz on Part 4 of *Unbroken* on our block days next week.

Spanish 1 [Part 1–7th grade] (DeMaio): This week, seventh grade students began learning vocabulary in context of the new topic "desayuno o almuerzo=breakfast or lunch." They did audio activities in which they had to read, listen to, and watch a video related to food and what other students eat at their schools in different Latin American countries. They also began conjugating verbs in -ir and -er, which is important for them to memorize and practice. They also began their research project about a Hispanic recipe. Next week they will continue learning more about this topic and possibly a quiz related to vocabulary.

Spanish 1 [Part 2–8th grade](DeMaio): This week, eighth grade students began learning about the new topic "De compras: ¿Cuánto cuesta?=Shopping: How much does it cost?" They did listening, reading, and writing activities to learn the new vocabulary. They also learned how to conjugate the verbs pensar, querer, and preferir doing activities in their workbook.
