## English Language Arts

This week we did an amazing job! In grammar we studied for and tested on pronouns. For reading we worked on our final whole class novel study, <u>Charlotte's Web.</u> We focused on comprehension through our novel study packet and played a game to work on context clues. We are really trying to work on applying our vocabulary. We continued on with our cursive. For writing we also did an amazing job writing friendly letters, and dipped our toes into some poetry.

Next week will be a lot of the same as we continue working through <u>Charlotte's Web</u>, cursive, and spelling. They will get their new spelling groups next week. We will be having the Classroom Spelling Bee on Tuesday, word lists are in Friday Folders. We will also continue working with poetry.

#### Religion

### Science

We are still mastering the types and traits of animals and are slowly adding more terms about how types of animals interact in their environment and in the food chain. We have been discussing herbivores, carnivores, omnivores, producers, consumers, and decomposers. I brought in my Venus Flytrap terrarium and we observed the traps close when gently poked with a paperclip. Next week we will create food chains and energy pyramids to show how all creatures of the environment are interdependent on each other.

We will have another test next Friday. We have been practicing short answer questions as a class in our science journals to help model sentence based writing responses.

#### **Social Studies**

Now that we have mastered an understanding of basic geography of the major continents we are moving on to the major ancient civilizations of the world. We began the study of Egypt and the students have already written and translated in ancient Egyptian hieroglyphics! They created their own cartouche and decoded a small message written in ancient script. We have been discussing how radically different life was in the distant past and that many things like architecture, writing, and growing crops were ideas that had to be invented. We also have talked about how rare it was to write and how the special class of scribes were the few people who could in ancient Egypt.

As part of Black history month I discussed the ancient Kingdom of Kush which was just south of Egypt. This ancient kingdom was conquered by Egypt and conquered Egypt for a time (known as the Kushite dynasty). It was near modern day Sudan and had a complex culture with its own unique pyramid style. The Kush kingdom built many more pyramids than the Egyptians actually. The Kush Kingdom focused on smaller pyramids placed over the burial site of a king, rather than massive pyramids like the Egyptians.
