Academics

We have had a great week. The students were really busy. We did some ice painting and made snowflakes using beads, and celebrated Catholic Schools week. The students made hats of the profession they were interested in. We read "Chrysanthemum" and talked about character traits.

- We are starting literacy groups and centers. They will be on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Monday and Friday will be whole group instruction. Some students will be focusing more on letter and letter sound, others will be in reading groups. We are also going to begin working on the concept of rhyming words
- In math we are starting a unit on measurement. The students will even get to measure themselves with cubes.

 Principal is asking that food be pre-packaged, (not home-baked), so that children can take the treats home. More on that next week. I will also be sending out a list of the students in class Valentine's
- Because we are beginning literacy groups our schedule will change a bit. I will send a revised one next week.
- It is very important that students get to school on time. Their morning work is always a review of our letter and a review in math. It is important to have that review. We will also begin our literacy groups earlier in the morning and it causes disruption

during instruction when a child is enters the classroom late.
