I would like for each child to have the car activity to practice word families at home. Please have your child practice the reading fluency passages at home also.

Math


We began our unit on time, practiced time to the hour with clocks, read The Very Grouchy Ladybug, made a ladybug out of an egg carton and played February themed math games.
