The 4-5th grades are finishing up <u>Charlie and the Chocolate</u> <u>Factory</u> and we will cap off that classic read with a movie day and compare/ contrast the 1971 version with the novel.

Fifth graders are also working on a joint Library/ Language Arts project which will count as one of their 3rd quarter IRA's.





Students will pick and read a CCS library book of their choice and create a digital booktalk to present during their library class using "Toontastic" or another approved video making app. The creation of their booktalk video will take place during library class. Welcome back to all! It has been a pleasure kicking off the new semester back in school from a long extended break. Here is what we have been up to:

K-2: We have been focused on gross motor skills and applying them to fitness games and utilizing different stations to practice specific gross motor movements.

3-5: This group has been working hard to improve their fitness skills. Many of these students have never performed some of the Fitness Test movements and are being introduced to new types of ways to improve their bodys strength and endurance. In Physical Education, we call this Fitness Testing. I am super excited and proud of the effort this group has put forward.

MS: Our older students have started a new cooperative team unit - Floor Hockey, a simulation of Ice hockey. We are focusing on simple game skills and will finish with an understanding of how to compete and play a Hockey game as a team.
