Science

This week students are completing their project on vertebrates and invertebrates.

Next week students will present their project, and will be introduced to earth's place in the solar system. They will learn about what causes the seasons, and how the moon interacts with the earth.

Social Studies

Next week students will locate Ancient China on a map and learn about its contributions, such as written language, architecture, and inventions.

Religion

This Week:

We continued our focus around Lent, completed activities that explored the significance of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving during this time, discussed how the church welcomes all of us through The Sacraments of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation), and learned how the Holy Spirit places a spiritual mark on our souls, connecting us to God forever. We also celebrated the feast of St Patrick, learned about his life and mission through his own personal Confession, videos, and other activities. We also explored the relationship between the shamrock and the Holy Trinity (God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit).

Next Week: As we move into the Fifth week of Lent, we will watch videos, read/discuss from our workbook, and complete activities that help us to build our relationship with God and to help us connect with the sacrifice that Jesus made for us and the joy that will come because of it on Easter. We will also begin planning for 3rd Grade's final Mass duties for the school year. On **March 28**, Ms. Grassi's homeroom will be in charge of leading the mass.
