Student Council presents 2025 Spring Spirit Week! Show your school spirit and earn points for your Spirit Team by dressing up each day. *Please read the guidelines for each day carefully:* 

#### • Monday, April 7 - Monochromatic Day

Students may dress in one solid color of their choice. No prints or patterns, no pajamas, no leggings. Sneakers or school shoes ONLY.

#### • Tuesday, April 8 - Fun Tie Day

All students can wear any fun tie with your school formal dress uniform (yes, you may wear it to Mass). No ties that light up or make noise.

#### • Wednesday, April 9 - College Day

Students may wear college-branded gear. Jeans, school pants, or college-branded sweatpants/pajama pants/shorts (school appropriate length); sweatshirts, t-shirts, accessories. No hats, no leggings. Sneakers or school shoes ONLY.

#### • Thursday, April 10 - Beach Day

#### • Friday, April 11 - Grade-Level Theme Day

Each grade level will decide on an appropriate, positive, fun theme for this day. The theme MUST be approved by their homeroom teachers. Normal dress down guidelines must be followed. Sneakers or school shoes ONLY. No leggings or fitted pajamas.

### Social Studies

This week in SS, students began to learn all about the Civil War! We started our week focusing on key differences between the North and South. We then learned about how the economy of the South heavily influenced their viewpoint on slavery. Students also learned about other causes of the Civil War as well as the Underground Railroad.

Next week, we will continue this unit.

### Math

This week in Math, we learned how to convert fractions into decimals and add/subtract them. We also reviewed for our math test. Next week we will begin measurement with metric and customary forms.

### Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students continued a new writing unit! Students are learning to write their own stories about characters and topics that interest them. This week, students learned how to add themes into their story and how to "show, not tell" in their writing. We are also reading *Because of Winn Dixie* to help support this process.

Next week, students will continue this work.


### Theology
