Math

Our sensational subtractors took their skills up a notch with an introduction to three-digit subtraction, including mentally subtracting 100s and 10s from three-digit numbers (examples: 300-200, 440-100, 620-10, 130-30, etc.) The Sloths and Cheetahs revisited regrouping, as well, using the same tried and true subtraction strategies: the traditional algorithm, base ten blocks, drawing, hundreds charts, and/or a combination of strategies. As a reminder, when using the algorithm, we like to use the following rhymes:

- More on the top, don't stop!
- More on the floor, go next door and get some more!
- Numbers the same? Zero's the game!

Math facts are our friends! Encourage your Sloth or Cheetah to flex his/her fact fluency muscles for 3-5 minutes daily! Fact fluency is brilliant and can be done just about anywhere...the kitchen table, at a bedroom desk, on the couch with grandma, you name it! With a little prep, it can be an on-the-go activity for all of life's dull moments! Stash some flashcards, playing cards, and/or dice in your car and you have fact fluency at your fingertips! Call-and-response practice is wonderful, too, and requires no materials!

Literacy

Tense tamers! The Sloths and Cheetahs are expertly navigating the world of past and present tense verbs, including how to properly add the suffixes -ing and -ed to verbs, both in isolation (worksheets) and in contextual writing.

Next week is Week 2 of our **TWO-WEEK** spelling cycle. Please help your sweet speller complete **4 activities** from the spelling/word work homework menu. Homework is due and a test will be given on **Thursday**, **March 30**.

Books are the passport to the world! Please support your child's reading at home with repeated reading fluency passages (timed reading to increase reading rate), read alouds (you read to child, modeling intonation and expression), partner reading (child reads aloud to you, another person, a well-behaved pet, or a lovey), and silent sustained reading (child reads to self). As you read together, ask questions, encourage your child to make predictions, search for spelling words (or words that fit the feature currently being studied), and practice decoding. You are the hero of your child's life story!

Authors Inspire! Our Sloths and Cheetahs are often inspired, both as authors and readers, by their favorite authors and books. Science/Social Studies
