Science

This week students will present their vertebrate and invertebrate project, and will be introduced to earth's place in the solar system. They will be introduced to the seasons, and how the moon interacts with the earth.

Next week students will continue to learn about what causes the seasons, and how the moon interacts with the earth.

Social Studies

This week students are learning about the Great Wall and will be introduced to the The Huang He River.

Next week students will locate Ancient China on a map and learn about its contributions, such as written language and inventions.

Math

This week students learned multiplication by using arrays, repeated addition, and the commutative property of multiplication. They will review repeated subtraction and be introduced to division.

Next week we will continue to learn strategies and vocabulary for multiplication and division. They will work on a problem solving investigation activity by using a table to organize the information in a word problem involving multiplication.

Religion

This Week:

We focused our attention around Lent, completed activities that explored the significance of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving during this time, and continued planning for 3rd Grade's final Mass duties for the school year. On **March 28**, Ms. Grassi's homeroom will be in charge of leading the mass.

Additionally, those who are Catholic went to Confession this week. In order to prepare for this sacrament, we did an examination of conscience and gave time for students to reflect on what sins they had committed. Other students did a similar reflection on how to make positive changes/improvements to their life and think of how their actions affect others. We stressed how important it is that you are truly sorry for your sins (contrition) and that you are determined to try and avoid committing these sins in the future (resolution).

Next Week: As we move into the Sixth week of Lent/Holy Week, we will watch videos, read/discuss from our workbook, and complete activities that help us to build our relationship with God and to help us connect with the sacrifice that Jesus made for us and the joy that will come because of it on Easter.
