Rising 7th grade students must provide updated immunization forms showing that they have received a Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis vaccine (Tdap) and the 1st Meningococcal (ManACWY) vaccine. HPV vaccine is recommended but not required by the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Students WILL NOT be allowed to start school without the appropriate immunization records. Please start sending them in from now.

6th Grade US History: This week the 6th grade finished their World War 2 unit. Next week, on Tuesday, they will take their World War 2 test.

7th Grade US History: This week the 7th grade finished their 1980s Unit. Next week they will move into the 90s and I will be asking them to bring in an artifact from the 70s, 80s, or 90s.

8th Grade World History: This week the 8th graders finished their Age of Exploration unit. Next week they will begin discussing Mesoamerican civilizations. On Friday we will be taking a field trip to Washington DC on Friday. At home they should be working on their Renaissance Project. The object they created is due April 7th and their Lab Report is Due on April 11th.

Math 6 (Garland): This past week we looked at equations that have fractions and decimals in them. We will revisit this skill on Monday. For the rest of the week, we will investigate how equations can help us solve word problems. I plan on assessing the students' one-step equation solving skills this coming Friday.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): We finished last week by introducing the percent proportion. This coming week, we will explore its uses with discounts and mark-ups(tax). Students will be exposed to real-world style consumer based problems that allow them to calculate total costs. This allows them to be more informed consumers.

Geometry (Garland): This past week we finished discovering the equation of a circle for the coordinate plane and how it relates back to the Pythagorean Theorem. This topic finishes

the new material for the unit on circles. This coming week, we will get ready for a test on Circles by quizzing on Monday, the 31st and reviewing on Tuesday, April 1st and Thursday April 3rd. A take-home test will be assigned on April 3rd.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we finished up our unit and tested on Solving Inequalities & Word Problems. We also started our next unit on ratios, rates and proportions. Next week, we will be dealing a lot with what is a better value in money and being a good consumer Also next week, the kids will gain digital access to their 2nd semester exam review. Please talk with them about how they plan to accomplish this assignment. We have been talking about finishing the year off strong and how the 4th quarter will go by very quickly. I have been encouraging the kids to take this quarter "One week at a time" to make sure that they are doing their best and not getting overwhelmed :

Algebra (Reid): This past week we tested on Polynomial Operations on their block day. We also started our next unit on Methods of Factoring which will feel like we are going in reverse $\$ To this point in the year we have been simplifying or solving which has felt like we are moving forward to an answer. Now, we are doing the inverse operation of simplifying which is factoring. It will feel a little awkward at first, but the kids are really getting the knack of it as we move forward in this unit. We have been talking about finishing the year off strong and how the 4th quarter will go by very quickly. 6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): The 6th graders took their verb test on Friday. Next week, we will start a unit on adverbs.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): The 6th graders took their *Abel's Island* test this week. Next week, we will start reading *Bridge to Terabithia*.

The 7th IRA is due in less than two weeks. It will be written in class on Tuesday, April 8th and Wednesday, April 9th.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we finished up our Poe unit by doing analytical work on the poetic elements in "The Raven." We spent time reviewing and preparing for the test. As we prepare for the next unit, please help your student to catch up on any missing assignments. Starting next week, we will discuss magical realism and begin reading Isabel Allende's *City of the Beasts*.

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we finished up our discussion of *Unbroken*, focusing on the theme of redemption and forgiveness in the book. We began engaging with some of the themes in William Golding's *Lord of the Flies* and started reading the text. We will have our first analysis quiz on chapters 1-3 next week.

Students also gave short "skits" on Mass responses. We will start next week again with a Mass readings quiz and Mass reflections.

7th(Mehl): This week we looked at the Tuesday Mass readings together, and then the students took a reading comprehension quiz on these readings. This was in preparation for the Mass reflections that they wrote on Tuesday after Mass. We started reading together the Passion narrative in the Gospel of Mark and did our spring Virtus training. Students also gave short "skits" on Mass responses. We will start next week again with a Mass readings quiz and Mass reflections.

8th(Mehl): This week we looked at the Tuesday Mass readings together, and then the students took a reading comprehension quiz on these readings. This was in preparation for the Mass reflections that they wrote on Tuesday after Mass. We read Acts 10 together, which describes Peter's meeting with Cornelius the centurion and the first acceptance of Gentiles into the Church. We also did our spring Virtus training. Students turned in their completed Church projects this week. The initial reactions to the first churches to arrive have been exceptionally positive and complimentary. The highlight of next week will be our trip to Washington, DC on Friday. Permission slips were due this week.

6th Grade Life Science: This week we investigated reptiles and practiced synthesizing data on lizard behavior in relation to temperature.
