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Social Studies

This week in SS, students finished up their unit on the Civil War! Students learned about how the war ended and some of the effects of the war. We will study the Reconstruction era next and learn about how America moved past the Civil War next.

Upon returning from Easter Break, students will complete a timeline project based on the Civil War.

Science

This week the kids completed their rock projects. In groups, they chose a journey of discovery by selecting a category of rocks that intrigued them the most: sedimentary, igneous, or metamorphic. After choosing their category, our budding geologists then selected a specific rock to research further. They uncovered fascinating facts about their chosen rocks such as how it forms, where it is found and what it's used for. They created illustrations of their rock of choice, showcasing their understanding of its physical properties through detailed drawings. When we return from break, we will begin Chapter 8: "Changes to Earth's Surface" and we are looking forward to learning about and observing the eclipse!

Math

As we journey throughout the year, it's important for us to take moments to reflect on the vast array of knowledge and skills our students have acquired in math. This week the kids engaged in a "spiral review", which allowed them to revisit and reinforce topics covered since the beginning of the year. When we return from break, we will begin Unit 13: "Units of Measurement and Data".

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students finished up their cross curricular research project in which they learned and wrote about the American Revolution. This was an incredible learning experience and one in which they worked very hard. Congratulations to all of our students for creating something wonderful!

Upon returning from Easter Break, students will begin our next novel *Some Places More Than Others* and begin our big culminating project in Language Arts.

Theology

This week in Theology we finished Unit 3 Lesson 14: "What turns us away from God's love?" Our students had the opportunity to participate in Eucharistic adoration and engage in the profound tradition of the Stations of the Cross. In addition to these activities, our students were hard at work rehearsing for the Passion Play. We are immensely proud of their efforts, and want to extend our heartfelt gratitude to you, our parents, for your unwavering support and encouragement in making this show possible.
