Science

This week students will present their vertebrate and invertebrate project, and will be introduced to earth's place in the solar system. They will be introduced to the seasons, and how the moon interacts with the earth.

Next week students will continue to learn about what causes the seasons, and how the moon interacts with the earth. We will be planting our lima bean, sunflower, and marigold plants in our school garden. Students will then observe and measure their growth rate throughout the rest of the school year.

Social Studies

This week students are learning about the Great Wall and will be introduced to the The Huang He River.

Next week students will locate Ancient China on a map and learn about its contributions, such as written language and inventions.

Math

This week students learned multiplication by using arrays, repeated addition, and the commutative property of multiplication. They will review repeated subtraction and be introduced to division. We have multiples from 0-10 going home in their homework folders to strengthen their multiplication skills and fluency.

Next week we will continue to learn strategies and vocabulary for multiplication and division. They will work on a problem solving investigation activity by using a table to organize the information in a word problem involving multiplication and division.

In preparation for this special time, we will be walking the stations of the cross and completing other activities that will bring us closer to Jesus, help us to recognize all that he sacrificed for us, and to begin celebrating his resurrection on Easter Sunday. We will also be examining the Easter Triduum, or last 3 days of Jesus' life (Holy Thursday - The Last Supper, Good Friday - Jesus' passion and crucifixion, and Holy Saturday - Mourning the death and burial of Jesus).
