This month we read some stories about dogs in K and 1. We specifically read two about the Iditarod which takes place in March. We also read some St. Patrick's Day stories and are now moving into Easter. In second grade we studied dinosaurs. Our first story was <u>Dinosaur Cove</u>. We also read nonfiction books that gave characteristics about dinosaurs. We finished Dinosaur Detectives, a Magic School Bus story. Their last dinosaur activity was to complete an ABC paper using words from the Third graders finished their fantasy book called <u>The Dragon of Doom</u> which is a Moongobble and Me series. After Easter we start another fantasy chapter book.

Fourth and fifth graders continue to select books for their assignments in LA class. Fourth grade is still reading a realistic fiction book. K-2: Striking With Implements / Skills Review / Introduce basketball skills

- We have continued to use different implements and practice striking objects using another object, such as your hand swinging and hitting a moving ball. We have introduced some base level basketball skills which is also a form of striking. When dribbling basketball we simply focus on tapping and pushing the ball toward the floor. As always, we keep busy with new Tag style activities that challenge movement, social interaction, and listening skills.

3-5: Basketball Skills Focus

- We have focused on general basketball skills such as Dribbling, Passing, and Shooting. We have explored the different types of dribbles, passes, and shots that can be made. We have covered some basic boundaries and rules and implemented all skill practice into game activities!

6-8: Basketball



In grades 3-5 students have been learning about animals! We learned vocabulary for pets, farm animals, and wild animals. Students practiced this vocabulary by talking about what animals they like (me gusta), what pets they have (yo tengo), and what colors the animals are (es rosado). They then played charades, hangman and pictionary to further practice the words. This week we incorporated parts of the body by playing another drawing game where students collaborated by each drawing a different animal body part (head, torso, legs, feet, ect) to make one crazy animal. The students then described the animals in Spanish.
