Social Studies

We focused on science this week.

Math

We finished learning about two dimensional and three dimensional shapes. We started working on writing missing numbers from 1 to 100 as well as counting by tens and ones. We also continued to practice counting to 100! Some of them already know how to count to 100. At this time, the students are expected to count to 75. The students have also been counting to 100 by 2s, 5s and 10s. We have calendar time during math every day.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The students are continuing to practice reading to self and work on writing. Please have your child read the books and reading comprehension packets sent home every Friday to you three times to practice sight words and fluency. **Our sight words this week were: just, from, any, how, know. Our sight words for next week are: put, take, every, old, by.**

Theology

We learned about St. Joseph, Pope John Paul II and Mother Teresa of Calcutta. We also learned why saints are important. We also started talking about Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent. We will be using the stations of the cross in the chapel or outside every Friday during Lent.

Science

We have been learning about force and motion. Yesterday we learned about the forces of push and pull. We did three experiments including Skittles and hot water, globies and using a catapult made out of popsicle sticks, a spoon and rubber bands.
